

Annemarie Annemarie Koelliker and her husband Roberto Saibene have planned their third trip to Tibet with much excitement and anticipation. 20 years have gone by since their first visit. How has Tibetan culture changed in that time?

Has the Chinese occupation – as often published in the media – resulted in disadvantages only or are there some positive effects?

To find answers to these questions the two travelled from Shanghai to Lhasa by train, on the world's highest railway. They then drove over 2000 km by car through the largely unknown parts of Eastern Tibet.

The multivision show offers views of destroyed monasteries and perfectly restored cultural sights, giant irrigation systems and anonymous Chinese settlements as well as fascinating green landscapes with breathtaking mountains, rivers and lakes.
